U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) Role in Protecting American **Agriculture and Public Health**

U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) Role in Protecting American Agriculture and Public Health is a 2-hour webinar session. The objective of this webinar is to educate the public on the mission, organization, roles and responsibilities of CBP at U.S. ports of entry (POE) and on the compliance requirements to Federal regulations related to the importation and transportation of biological materials. CBP enforces the regulations of 49 different Federal agencies and it is often the case that importation of biologicals was delayed or denied at the border due to lack of proper documentations. This webinar will take you through the steps of biological importation, permits and other documentations required, and CBP inspection process in various importation pathways; including which agency and contact information to call and bring "held" biological imports to compliance. Specific examples and cases of actual biological importations will be presented.
